WE LOVE THEM FIRST. THEN THE DOOR IS OPEN . . .

Some ask about our ministry, "Why don't you tell these girls to stop getting themselves in this situation? Can't you just sit them down when they have that test and tell them they are living in sin?"

To see a powerful picture of what this ministry is about, John 4—this moment with the Samaritan woman—is a perfect snapshot. Our message is not one of condemnation, but is one of hope and joy as we offer living water.

That would be easy wouldn't it? We could set everyone straight—in a hurry. But it would not be effective, and it might not even be Biblical.

We are not here to avoid the truth—Jesus certainly did not—but when presented in love, truth unlocks the door of freedom.

If we take a look at the Samaritan woman in John 4, we see Jesus approach her much differently. Instead of pointing to her shortcomings, Jesus first offered her living water, which only He could offer. She was amazed, and she wanted to hear more from this man.

So when a woman comes to us, we are reminded that while her choices may have put her in a difficult situation, she is not the first. A woman went to a well in Samaria, suffering from a string of poor choices.

Only then, after reaching out to her need, did Jesus ask her to call her husband. We know the story: she had no husband, though she had been a wife to five different men. She—like many we see—was in the midst of yet another dead-end relationship, this time living with a man outside of marriage.

Jesus could have condemned, and He could have sent her on her way, teaching us all a lesson of "righteousness." But without condemning, He offered her living water, a gift that brings life.

Yet instead of condemning, Jesus actually complimented her for telling the truth about her failed past. What could have been a terribly humiliating moment turned into a life-changing encounter.

She chose life. And if we keep reading in John 4, we find that others followed her. At her darkest hour, Jesus showed up. And a life was changed forever. This is a story worth emulating and at the Beaufort Women's Center we seek to see this story come true again and again.

DID YOU KNOW?

It is estimated that as of the end of March 2008, 84,000 babies have potentially been saved through OUP (Option Ultrasound Program) clinics, of which we are a part, by offering a combination of ultrasound and counseling services.

As Chairman of the Board of Directors for the Beaufort Women's Center, I want to thank you from the bottom of my heart for your help. Without your ongoing support, we would not exist, and neither would scores of boys and girls, each created in the image of God.

I also want to thank our volunteers that have given so generously of their time – the one thing that once spent can never be recovered – for the hours spent counseling, preparing, and doing the routine administration that needs to be done in order for us to function.

Like every 501c3, this has been a tough couple of years for us. Our donations are off about 40%, and every month it seems we get a notice that one of our long time donors has to take a break in their giving. We understand. We have never been flush with cash, but these times are teaching us to examine everything we do to see if there is a more efficient, more economical way to do it. We take the stewardship of your donations very seriously.

In the face of the decline in giving, our expenses have increased with the addition of the ultra sound machine and required staffing. This was to be expected, and we budgeted for it, but the economy has taken a toll on our supporters. We had a supporter that

wanted to and did cover our rent for over a year. They had to stop in the face of health issues. Paying the rent has been a huge, unforeseen burden.

These are our needs: first and foremost are your fervent prayers. As the Psalmist wrote, "Unless the Lord builds the house, they labor in vain that build it." Above everything else, we need, we covet, the covering of your prayers.

Second, we need cash. Your dollars donated translate into lives and souls saved - a pretty good Kingdom investment.

Finally - we need volunteers. We need experienced board members and volunteers for administration and counseling. We have a training class coming up in September. Please call us, we will be glad to meet with you and give you a tour of the Center.

This is your Beaufort Women's Center. On your behalf we are saving lives today and souls for eternity. We need you to step up, especially in these tough times.

IN TWO HOURS WE COULD CHANGE THE WORLD

Quite an audacious headline up there, isn't it? Can we really change the world in just two hours? Or is this just another catchy slogan to try to rope you into something?

Let me put my cards on the table: I am trying to rope you into something, but I also believe that you can make a major difference in our ministry.

Coming up this fall—on November 14th—we're looking forward to our Annual Walk for Life. As you may know, this event is one of our biggest fundraisers of the year. We count on these funds to strengthen this ministry and further reach out to the women we see. With a strong Walk, we look forward to touching more lives with our message—so that ultimately, more will be transformed by the love of Jesus Christ. And perhaps, more lives will be saved.

Many of you may have participated in our Walk in the past after learning about it through your church. We will have information ready for our participating churches to share with their members around the first of October.

However, for those that may not be a member of a local church or whose

church hasn't participated in the past, we will have sponsor forms available at the Center the first or second week in September.

You may be asking yourself what will two hours do for this effort. A lot! We invite you to stop by and pickup one of our Walk-For-Life pledge forms. All you'll need to do is fill out the form and begin by sponsoring yourself. That takes five minutes at the most. Not too difficult, is it?

Next, why not call up a few friends or family members—just a few—and let them know about what you are doing. Just tell them, "Hey, I'm walking in this fundraiser for the Beaufort Women's Center. It's a Christian pregnancy care ministry that assists women and families in unplanned pregnancies, sharing the love of Christ and offering life-giving options. Will you sponsor me with a one-time pledge?" From there, you can go over the amounts on the form, or think up one of your own.

Okay, that's two steps and about 30 minutes or so.

Third, why not post your sponsor form at your work or have it on your desk? It's

simple, and you don't have to say a word unless asked. Again, we're only talking about 15 minutes at the most.

So far, you've only spent an hour of your time. And my guess is, you might get close to—or even go well over—the average sponsorship of \$200.

Fourth and finally, come walk with us on November 14th or walk on your own. All you have to do is turn in your sponsor form and we'll do the rest. There is no collecting on your part—no hassles.

If you've ever wanted to give some of your time, or give to this ministry financially—this is the perfect opportunity. Like I said, we're only talking about a couple of hours and the impact of those two hours could be enormous when we look at the future of this ministry.

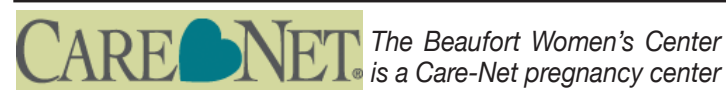
Why not walk with us this year? You could change a life—and save one too.
